- 1. Young
 - <u>Mid-thirties</u>
 - <u>Accomplished</u>
- 2. Privileged
 - Roman Citizen from Tarsus
 - <u>Elite Pharisaical Jew</u>
 - <u>Highly educated under Gamaliel</u>
- 3. <u>Hustler</u>
 - <u>Tent-maker</u>
 - <u>Tenacious author: Wrote at least 13 of the 27 books</u> of the New Testament (Hebrews?)
 - Lived on mission with discipline.

WHAT IS THE MISSION AND MESSAGE OF SAUL?

Mission: To destroy the church by imprisoning or killing disciples of Christ.

Message: <u>Abandon</u> the <u>heretical</u> beliefs of Christianity and <u>faithfully</u> follow the <u>Law</u> or I will <u>hunt</u> you down and throw you in <u>jail</u>.
