Message Reflection

In the second half of Romans 14, Paul talks about how it isn't enough for us to simply withhold condemnation of others in regards to matters of opinion, but that we need to exercise care and compassion for people with whom we disagree. He warns that when we do not do this, we are not "walking in love," and we are not showing the kind of love that Jesus has shown to us. Who can you show that kind of love to this week? Who can you show love to in the same way that Jesus has shown it to you?
